







Towards a Private Sector Accountability Protocol for Sustainable Development

An Initial Multi-Stakeholder Discussion United Nations Headquarters, New York 10 April 2014 in Conference Room B

Diverse criteria for sustainable development practices of private enterprises have been developed by various official, business and civil society organizations, particularly in the last 20 years. The Third Financing for Development (FfD) summit provides a unique opportunity to unify and strengthen those initiatives and begin to move them from voluntary commitments toward regulatory requirements, as proposed in the "zero draft" of the outcome document for the FFD conference, which is under negotiation. In this context, a "Private Sector Accountability Protocol for Sustainable Development" is proposed as a model framework for mandatory reporting by large enterprises and eventually to cover also medium-sized enterprises in priority sectors for sustainable development. The protocol would include both rules concerning financial transparency as well as sustainable development impact of financial, environmental, social and governance areas, so as to best deliver on promises to align businesses with the sustainable development goals.
